<p>Hello Jean-Philippe, I think I found a bug when displaying issues. To see it, you must have more than one page of issues.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. change sorting, e.g. click on "Sort by #"</li><li>2. go to the next page (click on "next" on the bottom of the list)</li><li>3. -&gt; BUG -&gt; I would expect the list to keep the ordering, however the ordering changes. So it is not possible to navigate through an ordered issues list.</li></ol> <p>If you have troubles replicating the bug, let me know.</p> <p>Bye, Pavol</p>

I found the problem - it is within the sort\_helper. It is necessary to update to the latest version (it works with this one: [http://www.methods.co.nz/misc/sort\\_helper.rb](http://www.methods.co.nz/misc/sort_helper.rb)).

It is then necessary to change the calls to "sort\_init" `"#{Issue.table_name}, "desc" to "sort_init #{Issue.table_name}, {:default_order => 'desc'"` because there is a change in sort\_init parameters.
