It would be preferable if instead of just having a "On hold" status, if the versions could use a status based on the enumerations and if we could add some statuses while defining if these statuses are open or closed. Somewhat like we have for the issues right now.

We have a custom Status type called "On Hold", which means we are aware of the issue or task but have no immediate plans to address it, but that we'd like to come back to it some time in the future. We don't want it showing up in our task lists for the time being, unless it's been specifically requested.

Ideally, it would be great if an "On Hold" issue could be "temporarily closed" -- that is, it would auto-reopen again after some period of time, like say 2-8 weeks.
