My first group "ActiveMembers" has selected the field "Issues can be assigned to this role", the second group "Viewer" does not have this selection.</p> <p>Behavior: all project members ("ActiveMembers" and "Viewers") are showing up in filter field "authors"</p> <p>Expected behavior: only user of "ActiveMembers" showing up in the filtering field "author". This would comply to field "assignee" where only users of "ActiveMembers" are shown.</p> <p>Background: keep project issues only to "ActiveMembers" but grant other access!</p> <p>Redmine: 1.3 stable, postgres 8.4, Ruby 1.8.7</p> | |
