#### Description

The attached patch fixes a minor bug in User.allowed\_to?

Specifically, that method should return a boolean, but it actually sometimes returns a Role instead. This is because .detect is used when really .any? should be used.

I am not aware of this causing any serious issues, but I noticed this during debugging and was greatly confused when allowed\_to? suddenly returned a Role ;).
