Forcing language codes to be <= 5 characters does not allow for "x-*" codes, which can be arbitrarily long:

"The most widely used standard for identifying languages in Internet documents (such as in HTTP headers or HTML metadata or in the XML lang attribute) is <u>RFC 4646</u> (formerly RFC 3066). In that standard, a three-letter identifier is interpreted as being a code from the <u>ISO 639-2</u> standard. RFC 4646 offers an extension mechanism of tags beginning with x- to handle custom codes for languages not covered in the standard." (*Source: http://www.ethnologue.com/codes/*)

There are also "i-*" codes for grandfathered codes. See also the w3c HTML4 spec for the lang attribute and RFC 17666.
