<b>Description</b>			
<p>I am working on an problem where users receive a 500 error page any time they attempt to attach documents to an issue using the files field. This is a new installation, so I suspect that problem is not related to Redmine itself. However, in addressing it I have noted that Redmine will lose any other updates that the user entered for that issue. Sometimes the lost effort is considerable.</p> <p>It would be better if Redmine provided some error handling in this case, allowing the issue updates to pass through while signaling to the user that their attempt to upload a file was unsuccessful.</p> <p>This is an issue that I would be happy to work on myself as time permits, but being new to both Ruby/Rails and Redmine it will take me awhile to figure out how all the pieces fit together. Not a professional programmer by any means.</p>
