This is a very minor issue, but when adding an issue relation, the log shows something like:			
<pre>Related to Bug #689: blah blah blah blah</pre>			
Removing this relation gives something like:			
<pre>Related to deleted (Bug #689: blah blah blah blah)</pre>			
I think it would be better to change this to:			
<pre>Related to Bug #689: blah blah blah blah</pre>			
It would indicate clearly that the issue was related to #xyz but it's no longer the case anymore.

- **Related to** deleted (Feature [#1005](#): Add the addition/removal/change of related issues to the history)

to be confusing about what was done

I have 3 ideas that would improve it IMHO:

1. Could be only the **Related to** being striped out, like:
 - ~~Related to~~ Feature [#1005](#) (*Add the addition/removal/change of related issues to the history*)
2. Or move the *deleted* word after the issue description, such as:
 - **Related to** Feature [#1005](#) (*Add the addition/removal/change of related issues to the history*) deleted
3. Or just rephrase the **Related to** part:
 - **No longer related to** Feature [#1005](#) (*Add the addition/removal/change of related issues to the history*)

What do you think?
