<b>Description</b> As in Ticket <a href="#">#25799</a> mentioned, there would be a little improvement for the ticket import via CSV useful: We want to use ticket imports for new projects, where we have our standard tickets. But we don't need all of these tickets for every new project. When deleting some rows, the relational row-link to the parent ticket can change. So it would help to relate to a defined ID-Column or something, where the ID doesn't change, even if rows are deleted inbetween.
