Thank you Mischa for the quick reply

The issue to me is that when leaving the **Applies Status** blank the revisions fail to be linked to the issues.

I would expect either:

- when leaving the **Applied Status** blank that revisions get linked to the denoted issues but that the issue status remains unchanged
- the **Applied Status** to be mandatory (non-empty) when saving the **Repositories settings**

with the former being my personal preference.
