"Translation missing, en, field\_issue\_to"

I added field\_issue\_to: Related issue to config/locales/en.yml and it worked.

I don't know if this is the proper solution, or is there somewhere in code that must be changed to field\_issue\_to\_id (because it has the same text).

The message when using a non existing issue (imagine a typo or a similar mistake) shows an error of translation instead of the proper error.

This seems to point at the error handler pointing to a non existing translation item.
