I installed latest redmine 5 and when I'm on issue list, right click is working but if I scroll down a little bit the page, the contextual menu does'nt appear anymore. Tried several browsers without success.

We have the same effect since we switched to Redmine 5.0.4 lately.

The context menu works for the first tickets in the ticket list but fails to work for tickets below.

Current workaround is to filter and sort the tickets so that the ones to be edited are listed on top.

Deinstalling the plugins is not an option for us with the production system so it would be great if someone with a plugin-free system could reproduce the behaviour.
