Ruby on Rails appends the "utf8=\(\Bar{\text{U}} \)" parameter to form URLs. I propose to remove this parameter by setting config.action view.default enforce utf8 to false.

The parameter is added to prevent older versions of Internet Explorer from encoding UTF-8 strings with Latin1. But Microsoft ended the support for Internet Explorer in 2021 and Redmine also dropped support for Internet Explorer in Redmine 5.0 (#34978). So, I believe the "utf8=\(\Bar{\text{u}} \)" parameter is no longer necessary.

Removing the "utf8=0" parameter has the following benefits:

- 1. URLs will be a bit cleaner
- 2. The code to handle "utf8=\(\Bar{\text{u}} \)" can be removed
