Description <p>The TOC as created by the {{toc}} macro doesn't render headers contained within {{ include }} pages. This means that you can't use the included page as a self-contained identity, because then it wouldn't appear in the TOC in the main page it gets included in.</p> <p>What I was doing was partition a large document into subpieces, and then include each subpiece using {{ include }}. However this means the {{toc}} stops working properly.</p>
