<b>Description</b> The code in mail_handler to create a user via email expects From lines in the form:  "Joe Bloggs <[a href="mailto:joe.bloggs@example.com">joe.bloggs@example.com>";  It fails to handle the following:  "Bloggs, Joe <[a href="mailto:joe.bloggs@example.com">joe.bloggs@example.com>"; "[a href="mailto:joe.bloggs@example.com">joe.bloggs@example.com <[a href="mailto:joe.bloggs@example.com">joe.bloggs@example.com>";  as the user's firstname cannot contain ",", or "@". As a quick fix I've added an extra line in create_user_from_email in mail_handler.rb to strip those from the firstname before the user is saved:  user.firstname = names.shift.gsub(/@.*\$/ , '').gsub(/,/ , '')  but this might not cover all cases. I'm just starting with ruby so apologies if this is hideous code.  regards,  Richard
